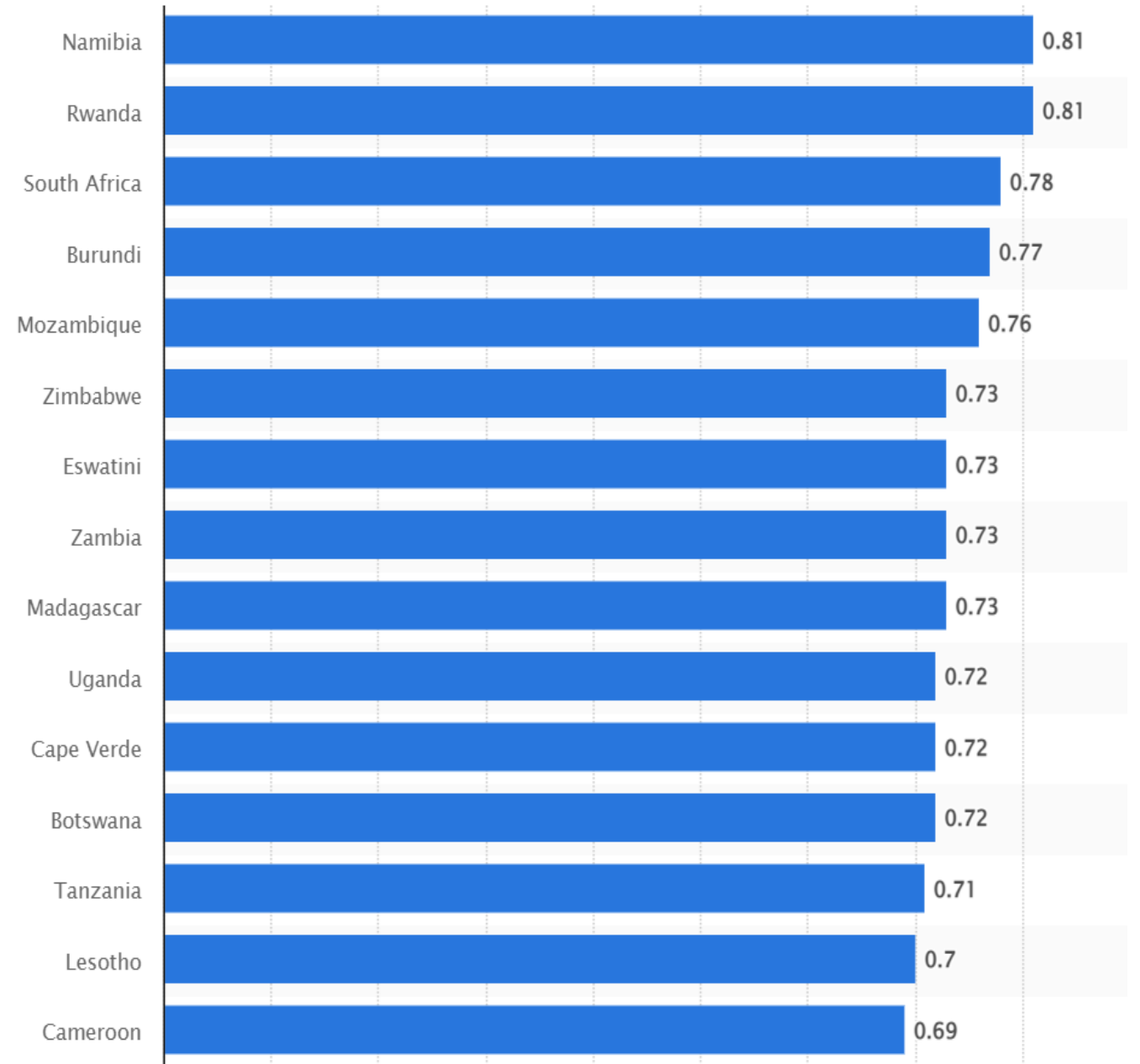
Gender gap Index

Global Gender Gap Index measures gender-based gaps based on four dimensions

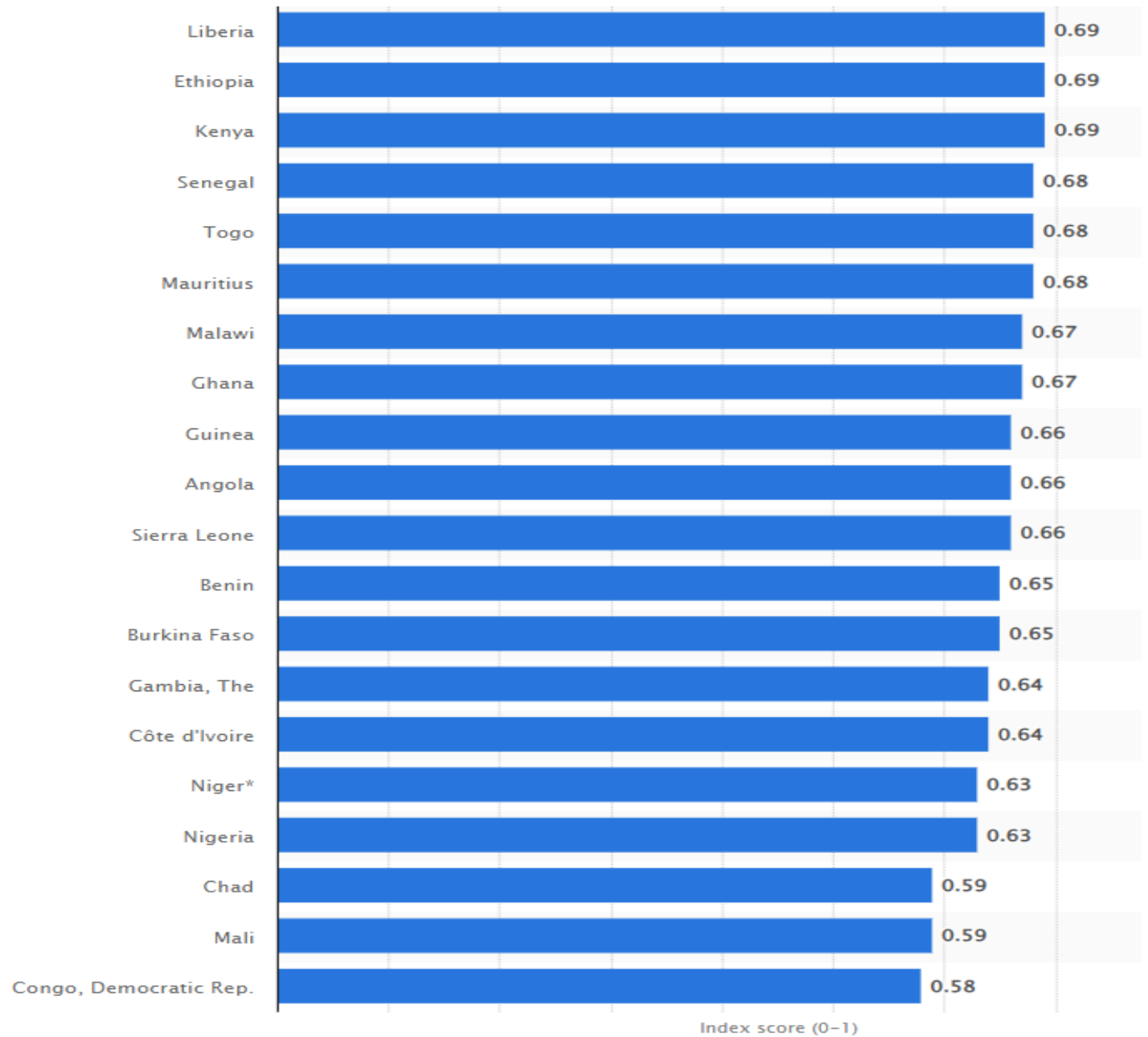
- Economic Participation and Opportunity
- Educational Attainment
- Health and Survival
- Political Empowerment

The highest possible score is one, which signifies total equality between women and men.
